Language in which courses are taught	German
Are there courses taught in English?	Yes, in the Master Programmes. Students at Bachelor level should have excellent command in German. How to find courses taught in English.

Are students required to have determined language skills in your language?	For the registration, we need proof for one language according to the main language of instruction. Should the student want to do courses in the other language, we ask for it when we sign the learning agreement.
	 Language of instruction = GERMAN: proof of language competence at least level B1 (certificate of a school, university or language institute). To pass exams in German we highly recommend to reach level B2 until arrival / taking a German course B2 before and/or during your stay. Language of instruction = ENGLISH: proof of language competence at least B2 (certificate of a school, university or language institute).
	Certificate must be issued in either English or German! High school certificates in other languages can only be accepted with an additional confirmation from the home university.
	IMPORTANT! Bachelor students in Architecture are not allowed to select courses of the Master programme Architecture nor the Master programme Building Sciences and Environment. Bachelor students can only choose from the Bachelor programme and must therefore

Does the number of students you are able to receive vary according to the number of students you will send?	have excellent command in German on level B2 (see language skills). This regulation will apply to applicants in Architecture from summer semester 2025. It does not apply to Spatial Planning! No
Is the choice of modules restricted for ERASMUS+ students?	No, students can choose courses from different fields and faculties, if the places are available. Except: Bachelor students in Architecture are NOT allowed to select Design Studios of the Master program Architecture. If Bachelor students want to take a Design Studio of the Bachelor programme, they must have excellent command in German (see language skills).
Final projects	Yes, if students are able to find a supervisor at TU Wien themselves; We do not offer such service. Master project: 30 ECTS Bachelor project: 5/10 - 12 ECTS

ECTS credits / workload	ECTS credits are awarded based on the amount of effort required to complete each course. The official workload of a semester is comprised of 30 ECTS credits. Note: Please keep in mind that the average time taken by local students to complete their studies at TU Wien is more than the official length of studies (for Bachelor 6 semesters / Master 4 semesters). This means that the average workload is less than 30 ECTS credits. A workload of 30 credits per semester or 60 credits per year should therefore be considered as more than an average Austrian student would perform during a year and means a very high workload, often impossible to complete.
