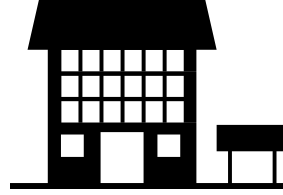

EARLY EXIT

possible option to finish before Christmas

! Most faculties offer courses in block 2 that have an "early exit" option (= finish before Christmas). ***This is only possible for students who need to return to their home institution for the second semester in January.*** In most cases less than 7.5 ECTS is awarded.

EXAMINATION PERIOD(S)

Each faculty has its own schedule. Examinations are based on course work, attendance and exams during the semester. Contact the faculty for more information.

ORIENTATION SESSION(S)

Universitywide orientation and social introduction: a week before classes start/ in the first week of the semester. Most faculties also have an orientation session.

Course levels

Courses on Bachelor's and/or Master's level available for incoming exchange students?

Both are possible.

Bachelor's: students need to have completed at least an equivalent of 60 ECTS (one year of fulltime study).

Master's: depending on student's academic level, prerequisites (differs per faculty) and departmental approval.

Transcripts

Each faculty has its own administration of credits and grades.

Transcripts will be sent digitally to the partner university and the student as soon as the transcript becomes available.

Language requirements

At Utrecht University excellent knowledge of either English or Dutch is required. Proof of language proficiency is compulsory if Dutch or English is not your native language.

Consult the table below for your required proof of proficiency. You are required to provide one of the documents applicable for your country. Note: exemptions may apply.

UCU Language Requirements

An advanced level of English language proficiency is required, as all courses at UCU are linguistically demanding.

Proof of English Proficiency: Must be recent and is only required for non-native English speakers.

One of the following must be uploaded in the Online Application System (OSIRIS):

- An English Language proficiency statement from the home university.
- An official English proficiency test certificate.

Minimum test scores:

- TOEFL: minimum score 100
- IELTS: 7.0, with at least 6.5 in each of the four components.
- Cambridge Certificate of Advanced English (CAE): grade B.
- Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE): grade C.

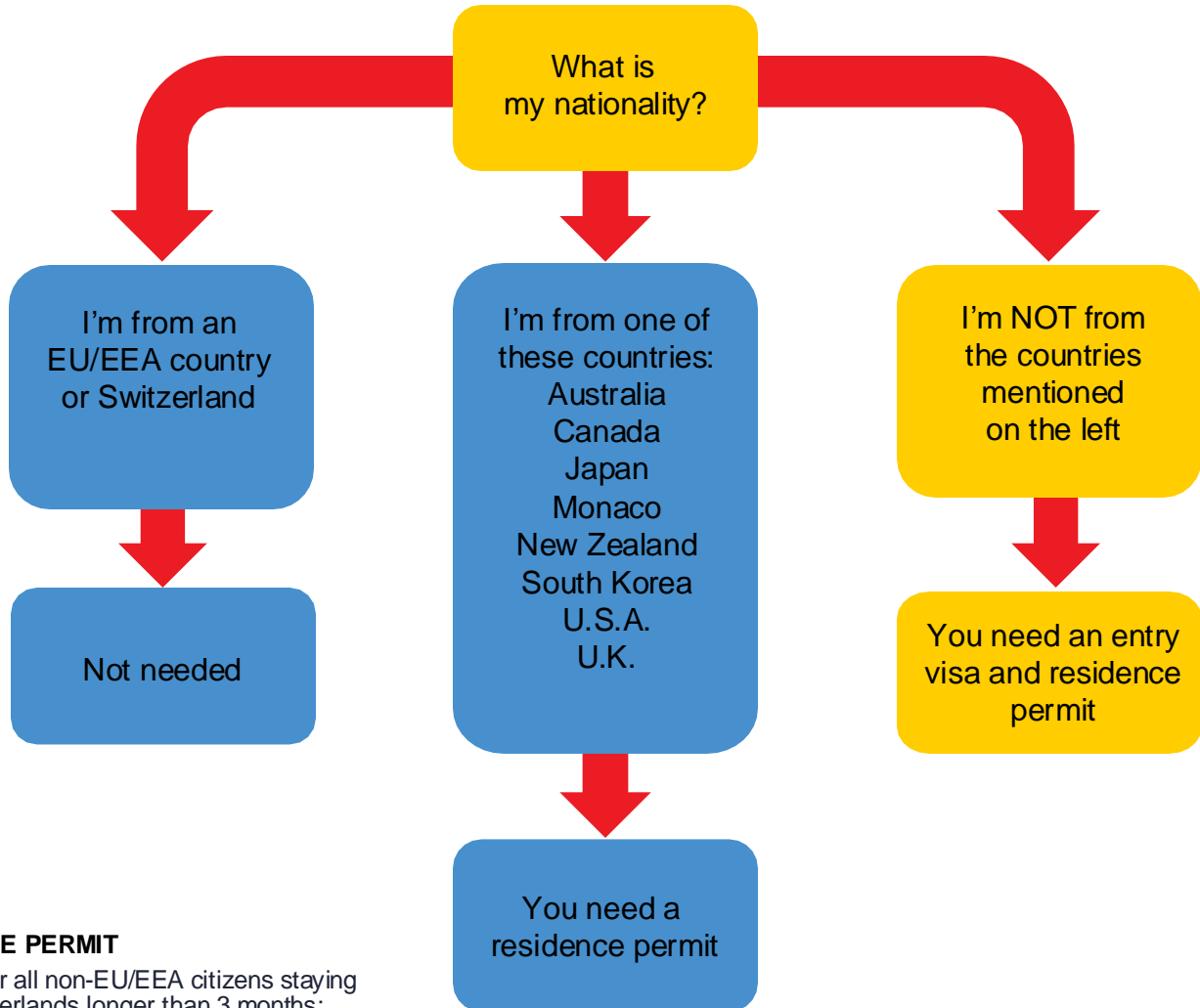

VISA REQUIREMENTS



RESIDENCE PERMIT

Required for all non-EU/EEA citizens staying in The Netherlands longer than 3 months; Exempted from applying for an Entry Visa (MVV) are students with a nationality from:

- Australia
- Canada
- Japan
- New Zealand
- Monaco
- South Korea
- Vatican City State
- United Kingdom
- U.S.A.

A residence permit is required for all non-EU/EEA citizens staying in The Netherlands longer than 3 months. After official acceptance, students will be informed about necessary documents.

ENTRY VISA & RESIDENCE PERMIT

For students from other countries mentioned on the left, we will apply for an entry visa. The entry visa and residence permit will be combined in the procedure. After official acceptance students will be informed about necessary documents.

HOUSING & FINANCES



Dutch universities do not own student housing. Instead, students are responsible for finding their own accommodation.

One of the ways to find housing is via the [UU Reserved Accommodation Programme for Exchange and Erasmus+ students](#). This programme has reserved housing for new, international students with student housing providers such as SSH Short Stay. The housing offered through this programme is furnished and available for fixed rental periods only (5 or 10 months).

Be aware that as offers are limited, finding housing through this programme is not guaranteed. For more information, visit www.uu.nl/housing.

When to start searching for housing?

It is a good idea to anticipate the time and effort it may take you to find a room and start your search for housing several months in advance. For students who are eligible for the Reserved Accommodation Programme, the registration and booking dates are posted on the website. If you are eligible, it is possible to apply for this housing prior to your formal admission.
