Winter Semester

- Welcome Session – 2nd week of September
- Semester Period – mid-September to beginning of January
- Alternative Assessment Period – one week in January (only for students who failed courses during the academic period described above with a minimum grade of 7, 8 or 9).

Spring Semester

- Welcome Session – 1st week of February
- Semester Period – second week of February to end-May
- Alternative Assessment Period – one week in the mid-June (only for students who failed the curricular units with a grade of 7, 8 or 9).

Visa information

EU nationals	Only require valid identification card for traveling to Portugal. For stays longer than 90 days, students must request a residence permit at SEF .
Non EU nationals	Must apply for student visa in the closest Portuguese Consulate or Embassy. And inform our Study Abroad where they applied for the visa.
Documents required for Student visa	Notwithstanding other required documents students will need to provide an acceptance letter from the School of Arts and Humanities. The acceptance letter will be sent to the students after completion and validation of the application.
Recommended time frame to request student visa	At least 90 days before arriving to Portugal
Visas with Schengen Member States	Students with a valid visa for a Schengen Member State don't need to request a second visa for Portugal.

Health insurance

European Health Insurance Card	Provides access to the Portuguese National Health System during a temporary stay. It does not replace a travel insurance.
International Health Insurance	Non EU nationals students are required to have a valid international health insurance during their stay.
School insurance	All students are required to have School insurance, which covers accidents within the scope of school activities.

Accommodation	The University of Lisbon has dorms available for exchange students. However, there are few places available. We recommend students to look for housing outside University residences.
